Weapons are the only products specifically designed to kill and injure. Treaties regulate global trade of many products, even bananas and dinosaur bones, but not guns and bullets. Through the efforts of the Control Arms campaign, governments are finally starting negotiations in July 2010. Now is the time to show Governments what kind of treaty we need.

A bullet-proof Arms Trade Treaty must:

- stop arms getting into the hands of people likely to commit war crimes, grave human rights abuses, terrorist attacks, or use arms to exacerbate armed violence and crime, gender-based violence and poverty.
- · control all arms and ammunition and their parts, and all those involved in their export and import.
- end the secrecy and corruption in the global arms trade.
- be enforced and policed, and hold governments to account.
